ABAAD

Afghan Women Forward

Is a humanitarian organization founded to address the urgent needs of Afghan women after the Taliban regained power in August 2021.



Founded by Sunita Viswanath, Masuda Sultan, and Jazmine Shaw—two Afghan Americans and one Indian American with extensive experience in advocating for women's rights in Afghanistan—ABAAD seeks to empower Afghan women and mitigate poverty and hunger by providing essential resources and skills. The organization envisions an Afghanistan where women are acknowledged as valuable societal members with access to resources that enable their contributions to the country's economic, social, and political stability.

ABAAD's primary programs include:

- Humanitarian Assistance: Targeted support for domestic violence survivors and mapping grassroots resources to aid at-risk families.
- Empower Afghan Girls Together (EAGT): A youth-led initiative offering education and empowerment opportunities to Afghan girls.
- Human Rights Dialogue: Facilitating discussions on human rights from an Islamic perspective to foster a sense of belonging and trust among women.

These initiatives collectively aim to uplift Afghan women, enabling them to support their families and contribute meaningfully to their communities and the nation's development.

Humanitarian Assistance

Since its establishment in 2021, ABAAD is committed to supporting Afghan families through meaningful assistance and resources. With a focus on addressing economic hardships, ABAAD works to provide essential aid to those in need. Its efforts aim to create opportunities for stability and growth, helping families build a more secure and hopeful future. focused ABAAD remains on meeting immediate needs while also addressing longterm challenges faced by Afghan families. By providing practical support and essential services, it continues to assist communities in overcoming difficulties and rebuilding their lives with dignity and purpose.





Our efforts have made a tangible difference: we have distributed food, cash assistance, children's supplies, health packages, and vital support for Afghan women. In our recent distribution, for example, we provided 28 essential food items, including flour, rice, cooking oil, and tea. We also delivered health essentials and children's care packages containing clothing, blankets, baby products, and other necessities.

ABAAD's commitment shines through in every act of kindness, uplifting Afghan families and empowering women to thrive. We are proud of the impact we've made and look forward to continuing our mission of support and compassion.

ABAAD has been committed to supporting survivors and victims of gender-based violence (GBV) residing in Women Protection Centers (Safe Shelters). On average, each month, ABAAD assists 22 women and their accompanying children. Through its efforts, a total of 154 clients have services, including received vital humanitarian food packages, psychosocial counseling, mediation and health medication. services. These services aim to address the immediate needs of these vulnerable individuals and provide support for rebuilding their lives.









EAGT

Empower Afghan Girls Together

The Empower Afghan Girls Together (EAGT) program is a free educational initiative designed to provide Afghan girls with essential academic and professional skills. The program's mission is to enhance confidence, leadership, and practical skills, empowering a generation of educated Afghan girls. EAGT envisions a future where Afghan girls are prepared to make significant contributions to their communities.

English Language Courses

We offer comprehensive English courses across five levels, from A1 to C1, with a dedicated teacher for each level. Our classes focus on all key language skills: writing, reading, listening, and speaking. These online sessions are conducted via Google Meet and supported by Google Classroom, ensuring an interactive and engaging learning experience for every student.

04

Online Conferences

We organize skill-building conferences and workshops focused on leadership, entrepreneurship, scholarships, opportunities, and cultural events for girls. These sessions are held online through Google Meet and Zoom, providing an accessible platform for students to learn and engage with experts from around the world.

02

Programming Courses

Our programming courses are led by three dedicated teachers, offering classes in HTML and Python. These courses are designed to build strong coding foundations, from web development to general programming skills. All sessions are conducted online via Google Meet, with additional resources and assignments managed through Google Classroom, providing students with a seamless and interactive learning experience.

Career Development

We offer internships, voluntary positions, and practical experiences that are held remotely. These opportunities allow students to gain hands-on experience, develop valuable skills, and contribute to meaningful projects, all while working from the comfort of their own homes.

Graphic Design & Calligraphy Courses

We offer training in Graphic Design and Calligraphy, focusing on essential design principles, with the guidance of two experienced teachers. These online classes are conducted via Google Meet and supported by Google Classroom, providing students with the tools and techniques to master these creative skills in an interactive and accessible format.

Story Writing and **Sharing**

Students write and share their personal stories, which helps them develop narrative skills while also serving as a fundraising tool that raises awareness and financial support. 07

Global Pathways for Girls (GPG)

The Global Pathways for Girls (GPG) initiative connects with girls scholarships and mentorship opportunities in seven countries: USA. UK. Canada. Australia. Germany, France, and Italy. Focused on bachelor's and master's programs, GPG equips participants with the and resources needed navigate scholarship applications. By addressing the lack of access to educational information in **GPG** underrepresented regions, fosters academic empowerment through expert mentorship and targeted guidance.

Duolingo English Test Preparation

Afghan girls participating in the EAGT program receive a tailored preparation for the Duolingo English Test, including customized study plans, tutoring sessions, and practice materials. These resources are designed to strengthen language skills and improve test performance. this support, With girls overcome language barriers, unlock global educational access to confidently opportunities, pursue their academic goals.

Tamana Jan Mohammad Kazim


Media and Communication Coordinator at Abaad & Public Relations Director at EAGT

English Language Instructor at EAGT



Fara Ibrahimi


Administrative Assistant at EAGT
